

PUBLIC NOTICE TELLS TRUTH ABOUT NEW HOSPITAL

Required Information Under Government Code Section 1251.052(b)(2)

The measure will appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

FOR

THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$43,000,000 TO PAY FOR THE PURCHASE, CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND RENOVATION OF BUILDINGS, THE EQUIPPING OF BUILDINGS FOR HOSPITAL PURPOSES, INCLUDING CLINICS, AND TO ACQUIRE AND OPERATE A MOBILE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AND FOR THE COSTS OF ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS; AND THE LEVY OF A TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF.

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ATTENTION LIBERTY COUNTY VOTER - LOCAL TAX INCREASE ELECTION AHEAD

The Liberty County Hospital District No. 1 has called for an election asking voters in the district to approve two Propositions that will have immediate negative impacts on property owners' tax bills:

Proposition A

Doubles your current Hospital District Tax Rate on all taxable property in the district. *Every property owner, regardless of age, disability, or military service may be subject to the higher rate, even if exemptions and property value freezes remain in place.*

Proposition B

Authorizes the Hospital District to issue bonds to build new facilities, acquire and operate a mobile emergency medical service (EMS), and to levy new taxes to pay for it (see the District's own Public Notice on the reverse side of this flyer for the true cost of the bonds).

Is costly *government-run healthcare* the best option for our communities?

As early voting begins on October 18th, voters must lay aside their fears and sentimental attachments and affirm that **It's Ok to Vote No!** to more taxes. These uncertain times call for sacrifices, not hubris. Voters today have an opportunity to be the kind of sacrificial leaders future generations will be thankful for.
